Meadway Gate.

Temple Fortune Hill, at entrance to Big Wood.

Denman Drive, near to Big Wood.

Oakwood Road, at entrance to Little Wood.

Central Square, opposite entrance to Institute.

Kingsley Way, near junction with Middleway.

Holne Chase, at junction with Rowan Walk.

Emmott Close, at junction with Kingsley Way.

Hampstead Way, at Heathcroft.

Widcombe Way, at junction

with Lyttelton Road.

Hill Rise, at junction with Hill Top.

Brim Hill, near junction with Greenhalgh Walk.

The Residents Association are arranging groups to clear some of the open spaces which have been allowed to accumulate rubbish. The skips will be available for the use of all residents and perhaps you and your neighbours might want to get together to organise your own street cleaning, clearing out the hedge-rows or than open space adjoining you. Refuse sacks will also be available at the skips.
