## INSTITUTE NEWS

The period between January and April, with its wild weather and short daylight hours, is widely acknowledged to be the severest test of the dedication of students on adult education courses. The Institute's adult education programme, however, like most others, continues right through the Winter and students who do brave the elements usually find that their efforts are worthwhile. This year, extensive work carried out on the heating and plumbing should help to reduce the disruption caused by low temperatures and burst pipes, which has, in the past, tried the patience of even the most committed students using certain rooms in the building.

A popular misconception which prevents some individuals from enrolling in January is that, because the course they wish to join may already have been running for a term, they will have missed too much, and will therefore be unable to benefit from it. Naturally this is true of some courses, but there are plenty of others to which it does not apply. Art and Craft courses, for example, where much of the teaching is done on an individual basis, and some physical activities, consisting of routines and movements which can be learned comparatively easily and carried out by people of varying ability, under the

supervision of the tutor. The Institute staff will be pleased to advise potential students about suitable courses.

Additionally, a number of new courses start between January and April. Demand has meant that some of them, such as Computer Appreciation — Mastering the Micro and Dishes for Entertaining are already full, but, at the time of writing, vacancies exist in several, including Hairdressing & Manicure, Counselling Skills in Everyday Life and Gardening in Spring. The regular courses are supplemented by a selection of intensive courses, occupying several hours on consecutive days, which take place outside the normal term dates. At half-term (February 15th-20th), there will be Junior Courses and Workshops in Art, Stained Glass, Badminton and Soccer Training, and Adult Workshops in Tapestry Weaving and Crochet. Between April 11th and 15th adult students will be able to choose from the following subjects: Art, Creative Embroidery, Picture Framing, Advanced Pottery and Sculpture, Bridge, Women on Course, and Focus on Film. ## AN ACT OF ALTRUISM

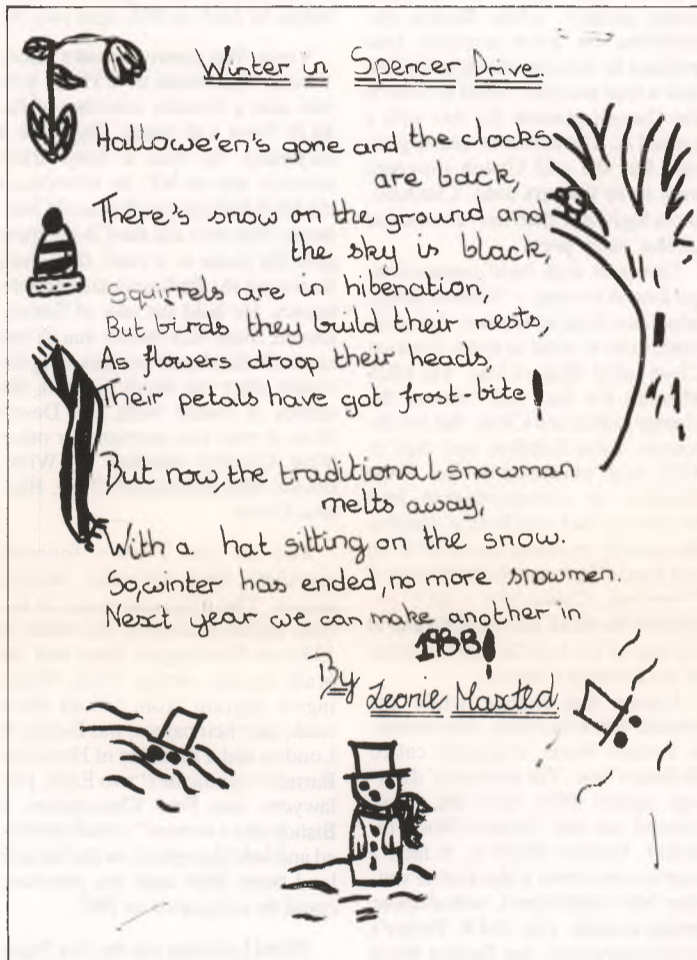
