"I remember these roads being made up" he says "and when all these houses had maids in uniform".



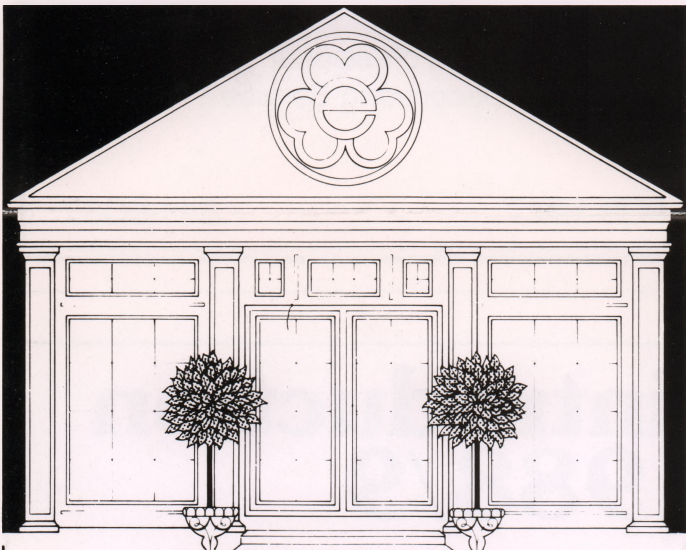
