LOTUS CHILDREN

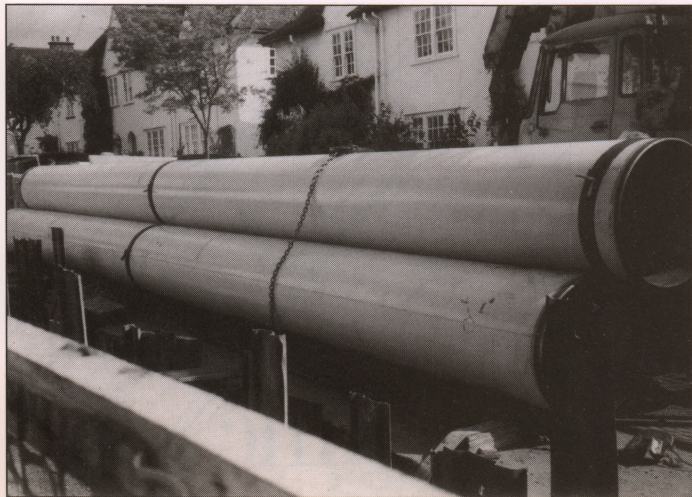
Untold, uncountable numbers of children in India having neither homes nor parents and live off the city streets.
