Edward Black read a prepared statement asking why the Trust was concerning itself with Eruv when no poles or wires would be on the Suburb. "It is outside the mandate of the Trust" he said "they have made no complaint about unsightly telegraph poles on Wildwood Road or the large Corporation of London signs all round the Heath or other unsightly street furniture".

Michael Max said "I have served on the Borough Council, lived on the Suburb since 1948 and went to Childs Way school. I know the offense the Eruv plan causes my non Jewish friends and to me. I was brought up to believe in integration, not segregation. This will be a pale separating this area from others."

Several speakers took strong exception to the letter to Barnet published in the Ham and High last week signed by Chris Kellerman, Trust Manager, and wanted to know whether it had been approved by the Trust Council.

David Bogush revealed that the first time he had seen the letter was in the Ham and High and recalled a Trust meeting in July when it had been decided that the Trust would not get involved and keep a low profile as it was an emotional issue. At no stage had he as a Council member been contacted by the Trust staff. "That letter was written on our behalf without our knowledge" he said.

It was following a number of other impassioned pleas for and against the Eruv itself that the vote of no confidence was taken and a visibly shaken Lord McGregor walked off the stage.

At a Council meeting on September 23 Lord McGregor's resignation was accepted with regret. Mervyn Miller is acting as Chairman, Gerry Mansell was co-opted in Lord McGregors place on the Council.

It has since been pointed out by the Trust that a check on the AGM visitors book revealed that 48% of the 119 present were not Trust Company members. RJW
