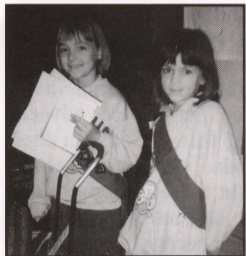

Who'll do What's On

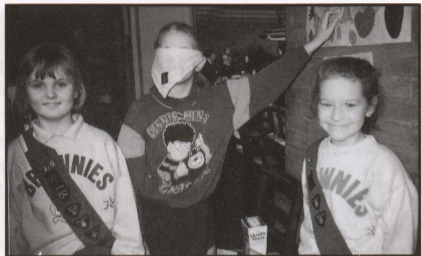
Jackie Norman has done this Valuable job for a number of years, but sadly she now has other commitments and so we are looking for a replacement.

certainly true that the majority of builders will be unable nowadays to build even the most traditional detail without a clear drawing.

Obvious examples of details to be got right are illustrated in the booklet: Roofs and Dormers, Doors, Windows and Bays. But of equal importance, and often taken for granted, the choice and workmanship of brickwork, rendering, roof tiling, leadwork, are crucial keys to the success of a repair or alteration job. They are the stuff of the care of Suburb buildings, and the link to its original builders.

In conclusion

To many people, these details are of peripheral interest in the environment of the Suburb, compared with issues such as increasing road traffic, crime, home insulation requirements, etc.

Clearly, it would be impossible for the Guidance to tackle all these issues.

But what it should be able to do is encourage us to walk about, using our eyes, learning from and enjoying the enormous variety of the place and thereby conceiving of ways to look after and further the quality of thought and vision which lies at the heart of the Garden Suburb."

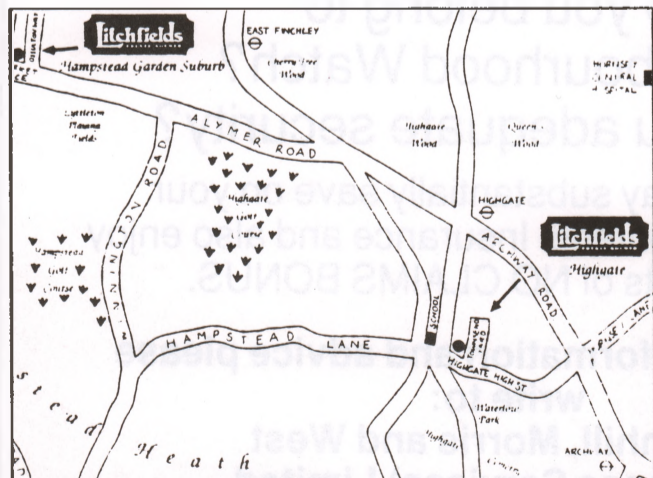
