Introduction to the Trust Council

The Trust has 8 members: 4 elected and 4 appointed.

Under the Articles of Association elected members are required to live on the Suburb while nominated members have to be non-residents.

IAN ANGUS appointed by the Victorian Society in 1991. He is an architect specialising in the conversion and restoration of older buildings, and lives in Holloway.

TEDDY BOURNE was appointed by the Law Society last November. He is a Partner in the property department of Coward Chance and lives in Hampstead. He was a member of the British Olympic fencing team in 1968, 1972 and 1976.

EDDIE CAPLIN was elected in 1993 and became Chairman in November of that year. He has lived on the Suburb for 16 years, the last 11 in Litchfield Way. Prior to joining the Trust Council he was the RA's appointee on the Trust's Property and Plans Committee for ten years. He is married with two children.

PIA DURAN was elected in 1992. She has lived all her life on the Suburb, for the last 16 years in Northway with her husband and 3 children. She is Chairman of the National Mencap Education Committee.

COLIN GREGORY was elected last year. He has lived all his life on the Suburb and

presently in Denman Drive. He works as a solicitor in the Government Legal Service. For many years he has been active in the Garden Suburb Theatre and has taken many leading roles.

ALAN HEWETT was appointed by the RIBA in 1993. He has specialised in the restoration of major London and country houses and clients have included the Garrick Club and Church Commissioners. He lives in Richmond. Recently he sailed across the Atlantic.

MAIRI HOWIE was first elected in 1990. She has lived on the Suburb for the last 40 years and for most of that time in Temple Fortune Lane. She is

married with 4 children, takes a keen interest in Suburb architecture and is a long standing member of the Charles Rennie Mackintosh Society.

MERVYN MILLER is the longest serving member of the Trust Council having first been appointed by the Royal Town Planning Institute in 1979, and is the Vice Chairman. He lives in Hertfordshire. He was co-author with Stuart Gray of the recent book on the Garden Suburb, and is a recognised expert on the Garden Suburb and Garden City Movements. Recently he published a definitive biography of Raymond Unwin.
