### Doreen Arenstein

A very accomplished potter whose bowls and pots make marvellous presents.

### Christine Barrow

Works from Addison Way and produces delightful original watercolour cards of teddy bears and flowers as well as full size pictures and superb painted silk scarves.



### Judy Bermant

Well established Hill Rise artist who regularly exhibits at the Royal Academy as well as the Garden Suburb Gallery.



### Freda Bolton

Handmade cards of watercolours of Suburb and local scenes as well as the original paintings.



### Helen Cohen

Helen's kiln in Heathgate produces very tasteful, and reasonably priced bowls, vases and other pottery in muted colours, "some look almost Chinese".

Beautifully simple watercolours of the Suburb and striking black and white prints on Japanese paper, much in demand for commissions.



### Jenny Dunn

Exuberant flower paintings in a "loose painterly style and with bold use of colour", perhaps inspired by her Temple Fortune Lane garden.

In addition to the usual wide range of cards there will be specially printed Christmas Cards with Suburb scenes.

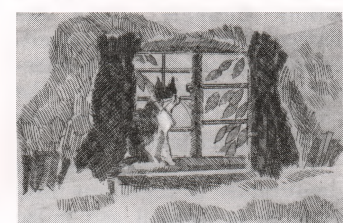
### Chloe Hilary Gear

Flowers, cats, landscapes, mostly in oil and mixed media on paper executed in her own free style, from a studio in Northway this time.

### Joan Knoblock

Portraits of children and adults from pencil sketches to full length portraits in oils to hang in the ancestral Suburb home.

Almost photographic pencil drawings of Suburb subjects. One in the Gallery now is a view from another Meadway Court studio.

### Sylvia Priestland

Many of Sylvia's pictures are a bit too large for the Gallery but we do have a series of lithographs of spring flowers and some other examples of her work from Temple Fortune Lane.

An architect by profession Alexander produces very delicate watercolours of local scenes. Visitors love the way he handles trees and water.

An artistic household this in Brim Hill, Diana is well known at craft fairs where her enamel jewellery is much admired.

Paints the Suburb "the way it is for people who live there" much in demand for commissions of favourite views and houses and gardens.



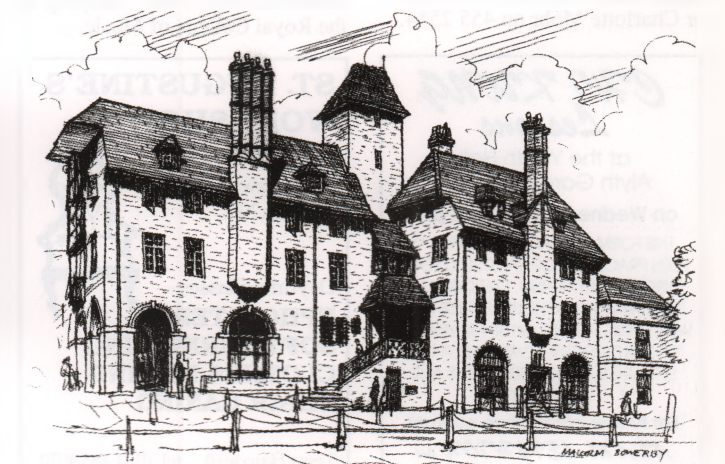
### Malcolm Sowerby
