What else to do?

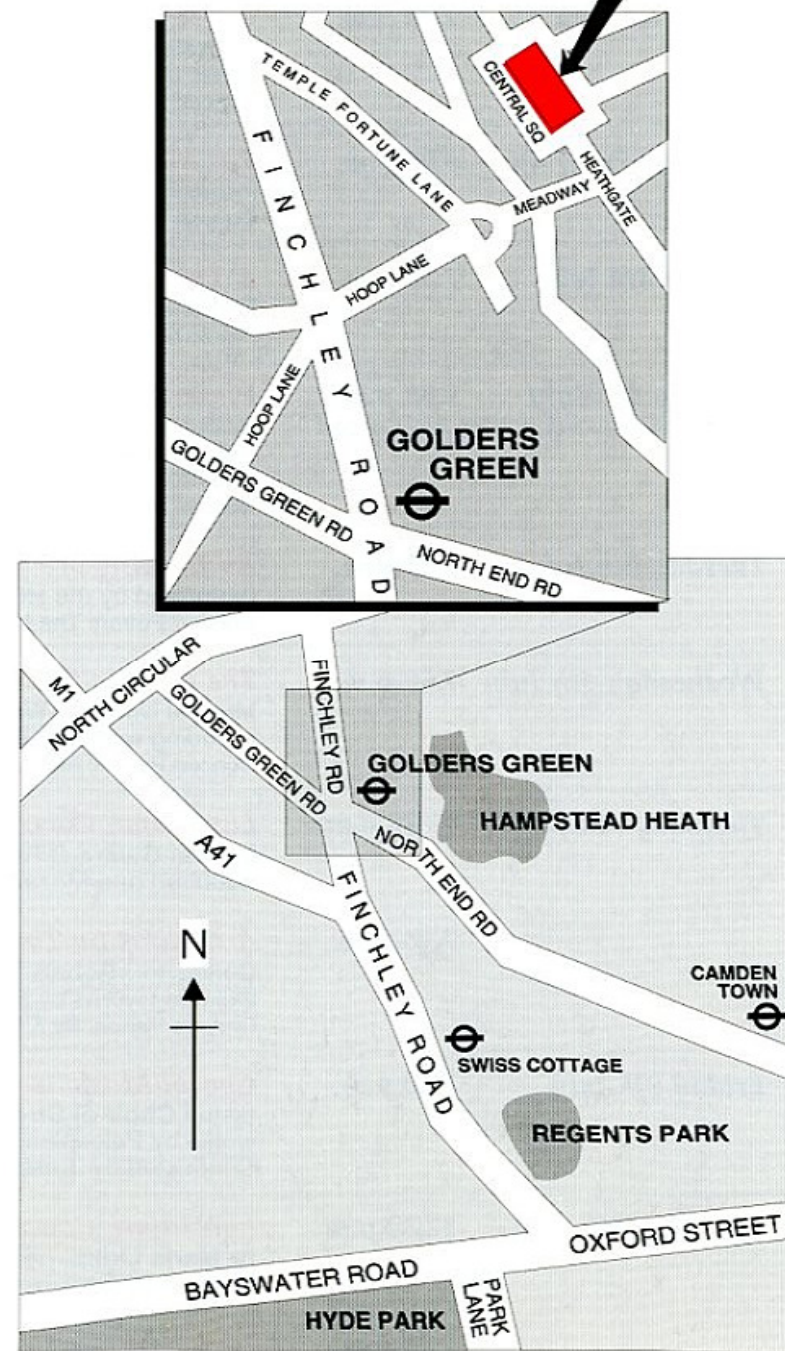
Why not combine your visit to St. Jude's with:

Where to find St. Jude's:

Travel by bus or tube to Golders Green Station (Northern Line). From here it is a pleasant 10 minutes walk to St. Jude's - or take the "Hoppa" H2 bus service except Sunday from Golders Green station to within 50 yards or so of the church. Taxi from central London - about £10. Car takes about half an hour.

St. Jude's is one of Britain's finest examples of the architecture of Sir Edwin Lutyens, the great turn of the century architect.


All ticket proceeds are to be donated to the *North London Hospice*, a multi faith hospice in North London which opened in 1990, and to the *St. Jude's Organ Appeal* to renovate the Henry Willis organ built originally in 1889.

St. Jude's church is renowned for its fine acoustics and is regularly used by several well known recording companies.
