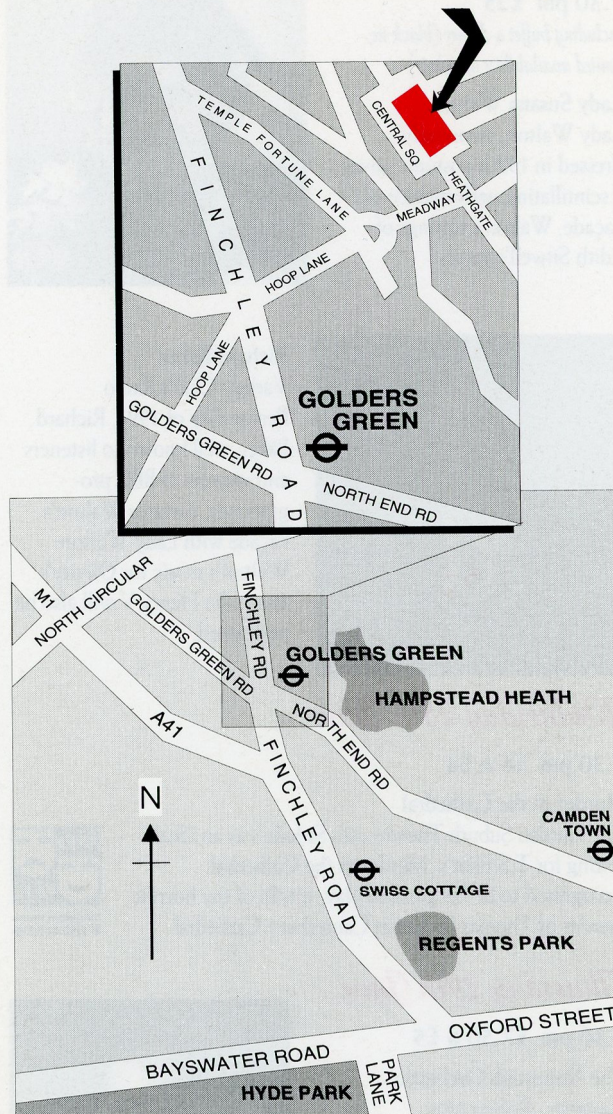
The Suburb at War

Ebony Steel Band

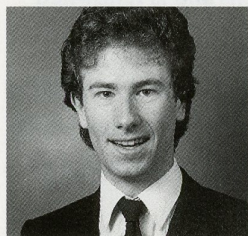
One of the world's leading steel bands gives a lively programme of calypso, classical, and contemporary music.

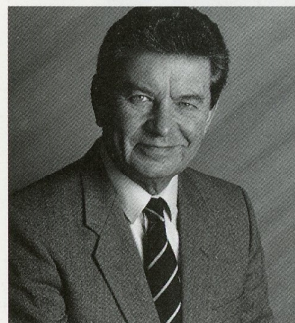
