The Proms at St Jude's are featured among events in the National Music Festival June 1996, supported by the Department of National Heritage.

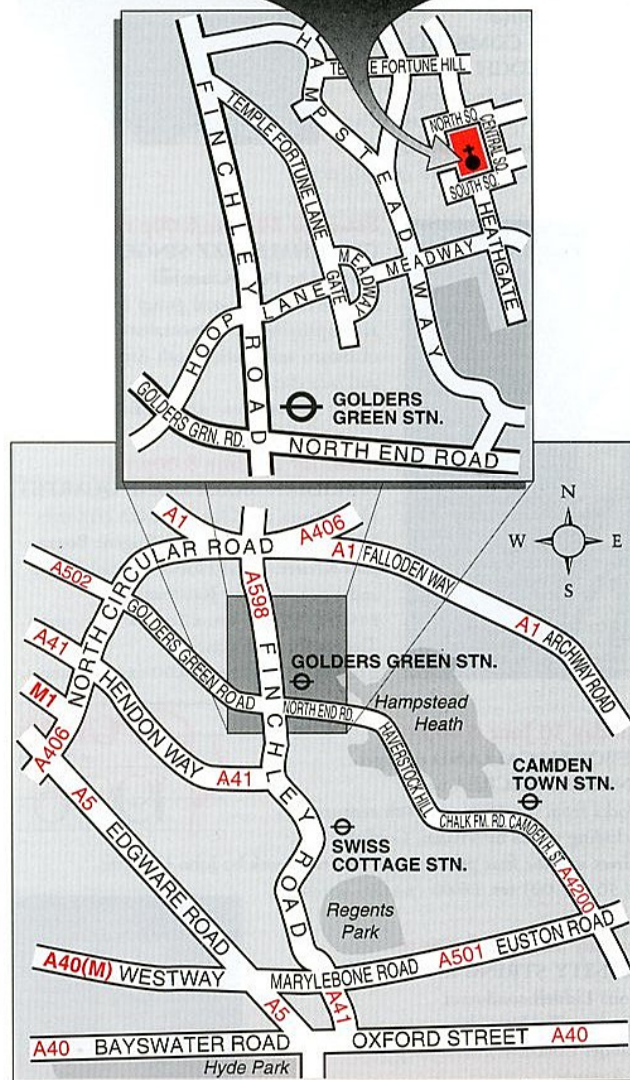
