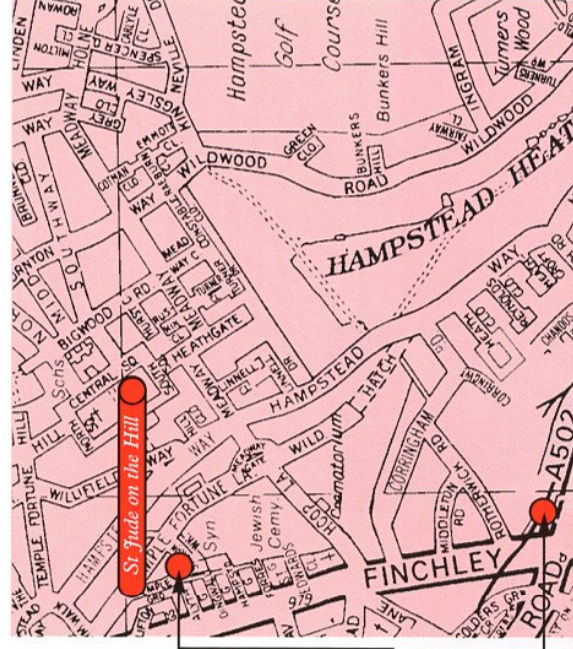
Three of London's most exciting and rounded musical talents perform music by Brahms and Dvorak.
