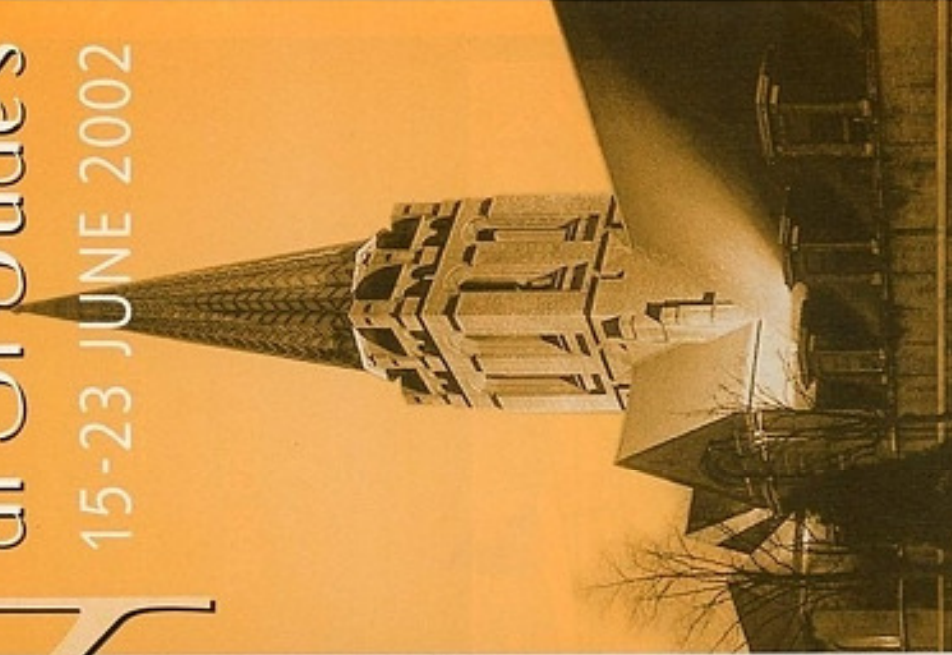

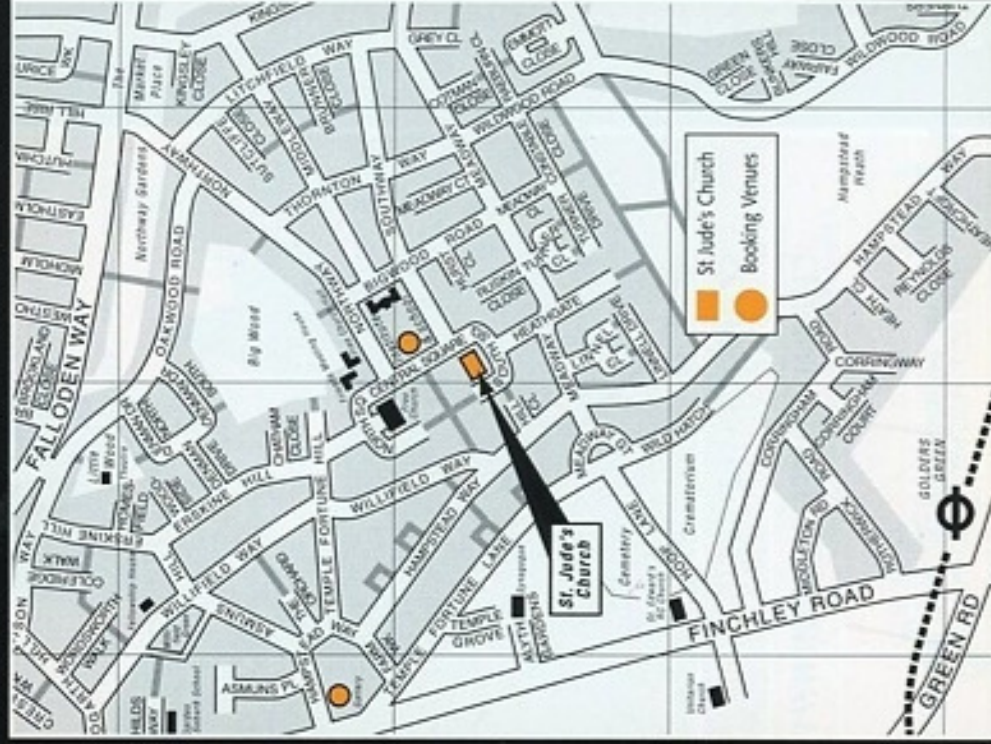

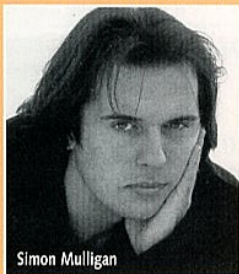
PROMS AT ST JUDE'S 2002 EVENING PROGRAMME

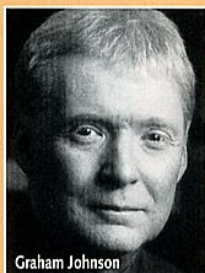

Tuesday 18 June

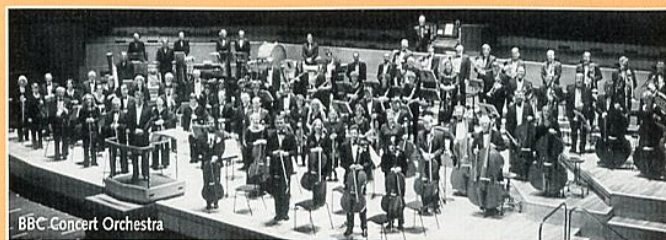
Choral Concert

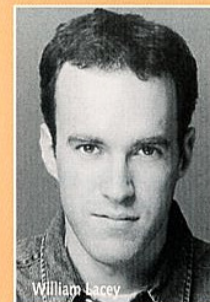
Last Night of the Proms at St Jude's

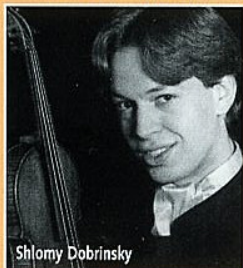
Samuel & Henrietta Barnett Day

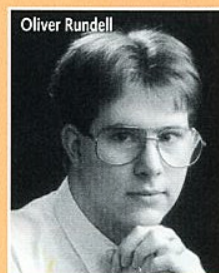
