JOELY KOOS

Like Charlie, Joely dreamed of owning a chocolate factory as a young child, but realised, at the age of nine, that her true love was the cello. Having musical parents was a bit like being in the circus and inevitably she was drawn into the family business!



Joely now pursues a varied musical career as a chamber musician, soloist and orchestral principal. Performing as co-principal with the City of London Sinfonia and the London Chamber Orchestra, she is also regularly invited as guest principal with many orchestras, including the Bournemouth Symphony, the BBC Philharmonic and the BBC National Orchestra of Wales.

Solo ventures in the last few years include participating in several music festivals, including the Frinton Music Festival, the Fitzfest, the Suffolk Cello Festival, and performing Schumann's Cello Concerto with the Amadeus Ensemble. She appeared as

soloist on Radio 3 with the London Sinfonietta in a British première of Haddad's 'In Contradiction' and also gave a world première performance of Roddy Williams's 'Homage to Bach's Bourrée', when she was soloist with City of London Sinfonia.

For the last twenty years Joely has very much enjoyed being Professor of Cello at Trinity Laban Conservatoire. She has been invited to give masterclasses at the Cello Society; she is a masterclass coach with 'Cello Dynamo'; and she is also cello tutor for the Hertfordshire County Youth Orchestra.

Educated at Chetham's School as a joint first study pianist and cellist, Joely subsequently won scholarships to both Cambridge University and then the Royal Academy of Music.



Finishing her studies at the Banff International Music Centre with a scholarship from the Munster Trust, Joely went on to be a prizewinner in the Jacqueline du Pré International Competition.

For relaxation Joely likes to play her cello and sing at the same time – it feels a bit like juggling. But her favourite moments are when she can share music-making with her husband and two children ... the family business is going strong!
