One of the four main issues around which activities are being planned by the UN Secretariat is Promoting Independence, with particular emphasis on health, social and safety issues.

Horticultural Society celebrates 90 years on the Suburb



This year sees the Hampstead Garden Suburb Horticultural Society's 90th anniversary and we shall celebrate with cake-cutting ceremonies at our shows in July and September.

In addition, at the September show there will be a display of memorabilia from the Suburb archives.

At the moment the Society puts on two shows a year, bringing a real breath of the country to the Free Church Hall in July and September. The autumn and winter lectures, and the very popular May Plant Sale, are held at Fellowship House.

But...will there be a Flower Show to mark the millennium year?

Sadly, the answer will be no, unless residents come forward to help run the Horticultural Society in the future. In order to continue we need your help. There are innumerable small jobs connected with our activities, ranging from collecting entry fees at the door, making cakes for the teas and helping to serve them, or just giving a hand to clear up after the shows at 6.00pm - all essential but not too arduous. Four of the Society's present Officers have served a total of some 65 years between them and now wish to take a well-earned retirement after 1999, including the present Secretary. Although an interest in growing things, flower arranging or domestic economy (cooking, preserving, etc) would make the work more enjoyable, gardening expertise is not necessary. But some secretarial skills would be useful. We are also looking for a new Membership Secretary, which involves some record-keeping of those who pay an

annual subscription, but no collecting is required, since this is done by volunteers.

Six to eight new committee members are also needed, to bring in fresh ideas and to help with numerous jobs such as photocopying, putting up posters, suggesting topics for future lectures, writing to potential speakers and doing the cards on entry nights, etc.

Exhibitors needed

Above all, this is the Garden Suburb. There must be thousands of roses growing in Suburb gardens. In the week of the shows, look very carefully at yours, or your other flowers. Most likely there will be at least two or three blooms of entry standard. And many of you make jam and cook, or grow vegetables. Why not show off? Just ensure that you enter for the July show by Tuesday, 29 June, and for the September show by Wednesday 15 September; both entry nights will be held at Fellowship House between 7 and 8pm. Alternatively post or deliver entries to the Show Secretary at 103 Hampstead Way, NW11 7LR. The Plant Sale takes place at 10.00am on Saturday 22 May at Fellowship House. The Flower Shows will be held from 3.00 to 5.30pm at the Free Church Hall on 3 July and 18 September.
