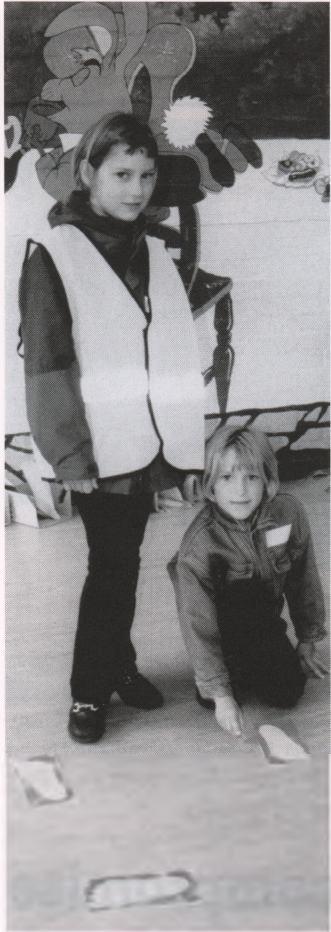


Walk to school day

It was the first Garden Suburb LA 21 Partnership initiative and one that involved Suburb schools, the RA and the local authority.

Organised by LA21 member Nancy Boulicault, the Walk to School Day coincided with Barnet's Walk to School Week.

It started with a special assembly at the Garden Suburb School where sound and visual effects were used to impress on the pupils the values of walking to school.

On the day volunteers from Henrietta Barnett School Green Team, headed by Laura Impalomeni, and from the LA 21 committee enjoyed an early start with coffee

and croissants from Waitrose. They then guarded crossing points that had been worked out by Barnet's Accident Prevention Centre. Each crossing point had colourful feet on the pavement showing the way and children signed their names in chalk and received a sticker as they passed. Later in the day Dawn Orr had arranged a Fellowship presence in the school at break time to distribute fruit, again generously supplied by Waitrose, and to talk to today's children about walking to school in bygone days.

One resident close to the school estimated a 40% reduction in traffic.

Hampstead & Highgate Festival

The Hampstead & Highgate Festival, under Suburb resident Barry Millington as artistic director, provided the area with a wide variety of cultural events. On the Suburb the RA Events Committee organised walks and garden visits that were oversubscribed, and St Jude's was the venue for a concert by the Chilingirian Quartet. Vera Segal was there for Suburb News.

On 22 June, St Jude's was once more the home of music. This was a concert given by the Chilingirian Quartet as part of the Festival.

Barry Millington has the knack of pulling a surprise composer

out of his artistic hat, as he did last year when filling the same role at the Proms. This year it was a Finnish composer, Einojuhani Rautavaara - as yet little known in this country. Born in Helsinki in 1928, he studied at the Sibelius Academy and Helsinki University, and spent some time in Vienna. He also attended the Juilliard School of Music in New York in 1955-6.

His String Quintet has the subtitle 'Unknown Heaven'. The original commission was for a quartet, but according to the composer, the work developed a will of its own and demanded a second cello. One can understand how this can happen - the work is like a musical stream of consciousness, full of wistful wandering themes that float away onwards and upwards into the distance. The composer himself was present to receive the applause of the audience at the end of the performance.

The other two works were by Schubert. The Quarttsatz in C minor D703, and the exquisitely beautiful and well known String Quintet in c major D956, which also has the unusual addition of a 2nd cello to the quartet format.

The quartet of players - Levon Chilingirian (violin), Charles Sewart (violin), Asdis Valdimarsdottir (viola), Philip De Groot (cello) and guest Stephen Orton (cello) gave a masterly performance of such diversity of music, reaching the standard of perfection one has come to expect.
