Chairman's introduction 1998-99

Ian Angus has left the Trust Council after over 7 years of providing level-headed advice and constructive architectural insight. We welcome as his replacement, appointed by the Victorian Society, David Pickles who, as a former Trust Architect, is exceptionally well qualified for this role.

This year, there will be two elected member vacancies; my maximum term expires in September and Mervyn Mandell stands for re-election for a second term of 3 years.

Since my report last year, the Trust has appointed David Davidson as our Architectural Adviser. David's background in conservation in Birmingham, his understanding of buildings of the Suburb period and his patience have allowed him to take up this role effectively from his arrival.

Congratulations to Mervyn Miller (Trust Council member for the past 20 years) whose quarter century of conservation expertise has been recognised by a Visiting Fellowship at Oxford Brookes University.

The past year has seen a continuation of our activities including high levels of planning applications, grants to Suburb events and spending on environmental improvements.

The long running dispute between the Institute and Henrietta Barnett School has finally been settled. This has been achieved within a framework of what the Trust had hoped for, that both of these creations of

our founder, Henrietta Barnett, could be provided with a viable long term future and continue to stay on the Suburb. We are currently exploring options which could be of help in achieving these aims permanently. The terms of the settlement in no way alter our planning controls over buildings in Central Square; over the coming years we can expect limited new development offset by removal of the 'temporary' huts.

Looking back over my 6 years on the Trust Council, I believe that this has been a constructive period. We have improved the consistency and transparency of planning application procedures, revived the link with the former Charitable Trust through adopting charitable status ourselves, continued a sound management policy (reserves have grown by 78% in this time) and using our influence and funds to prime improvements for our environment and amenities.

During my Chairmanship, I am very pleased that Trust Council decisions have all been freely discussed, differences have been resolved and that we have worked well as a team. Once again I must thank my fellow trustees, past and present, for their dedication to the Suburb. Thanks too to the ever cheerful and efficient office staff.
