New Memorial Gate

A small group of residents gathered on 4th July to celebrate the new Memorial Gate at the Temple Fortune Hill entrance of Big Wood. Members of the RA's Trees & Open Spaces Committee were joined by a group from the church of Montrouge in Paris, which is twinned with the Free Church, who were visiting to attend Tony Spring's retiring service. As one of his last official acts, Tony Spring listed the Suburb civilians killed during WWII who are commemorated by the gate, and the group drank a toast to the gate.

Last December vandals driving a golf buggy through the wood smashed the first memorial gate which had been generously donated by Michael Holton, a historian of WWII, who had painstakingly researched the names of those who died. Barnet would not remove the shattered remains so it was local residents who tidied away the pile of broken wood and saved the memorial carving. The Suburb is indebted to the Trust for funding and arranging a replacement so quickly.
