Trust Annual General Meeting

The next AGM of the Hampstead Garden Suburb Trust will be upon us on September 14, and this year it will be followed by the election of two resident members to the Trust Council. As we go to press there are two declared candidates, Michael Franklin and Richard Wiseman, both of whom are standing down by rotation, but are to stand again for the second three-year term allowed by the constitution. They have both written a brief statement, which readers can find below.

It is a trustee's duty to ensure a charity remains true to its charitable purpose and objects as set out in its governing documents. For us this means that our trustees ensure the Trust does all things possible to maintain and preserve the present character and amenities of the Suburb using the tools at its disposal.

The Trust has the responsibility of maintaining the Suburb as an important example of twentieth century suburban design, and it is also our best protector against inappropriate development. In order to do this effectively the Trust must not only be able to initiate legal action when necessary, but also to respond to action taken against it, and to get any external advice it needs to decide on legal or other matters.

We need trustees who are prepared to use the law to defend the Suburb when needed. If owners and developers think that the Trust lacks the will or resources to do so, they will be quick to exploit the weakness. It is up to us to show by our votes that we are prepared to support those who will protect us.

Trustees have to ensure the Trust remains solvent and has the resources necessary to do its job properly. The management charge has remained in its target range for the last eight years and remains cheaper than a TV licence or my daily newspaper; I would say that is good value for money.

At the moment we have only two candidates for two seats,

but other people could decide to stand and create a contest between now and the AGM on September 14. So if you are a member and we have a disputed election, please use your vote for a candidate who, by supporting the objectives of the Trust, will put the Suburb first.

Finally it is very important for me to say that the above represents my personal views and not those of anyone else or any group.

If you are not a member of the Trust and have lived in the Suburb for three or more years, you can easily become a member and it is free. Contact the Trust office or go to www.hgstrust.org and follow the link to membership for details. Those with less than 3 years as residents can become associate members.

Candidate Statements

MICHAEL FRANKLIN



I have now spent three years as a Trustee on the HGS Trust and I will be standing for re-election at the AGM. What I have enjoyed most during this time is being able to give something back to my community and help in a small way to preserve the unique character of Hampstead Garden Suburb. I am currently Chair of the Grants Committee and serve on the Finance Committee, the Property and Plans Committee and the Estates Committee.

I hope to be able to continue to serve on the Trust.

I have been chairman of the Trust Council since 2013 and will be standing again as a Trustee at the next AGM. During my time as chairman we have not only built on the solid achievements of my predecessors but have advanced the amenity and character of the Suburb in a number of ways which will enhance the area for years to come. These achievements include:

- Continuing to improve the precarious financial situation of the Trust to ensure it can continue its work into the far future;
- restoration of the 'Great Wall';
- clarification of the Design Guidance so far as it applies to basements, in particular by spelling out some issues which are more likely than not to result in applications being refused or granted – but always respecting the need to treat every application on its individual merits.
- any number of enforcement measures against building for which no consent has been obtained. These measures run from informal conversations with the residents concerned and getting unauthorised work removed, right through to legal proceedings when necessary. Even in cases where obtaining an injunction would have involved taking unacceptable legal risks, we have obtained substantial damages in lieu which will be applied to a project which will benefit the Suburb.
- completion of the Tree Survey, providing a baseline inventory of important trees on the Suburb which will help us to give sound advice if important trees come under threat.

HGS Golf Society

The HGS Golf Society is calling all golfers and anyone interested in taking up the game.

There are many activities available to Suburb residents, but one thing missing is a golf society. Many of our residents may belong to golf clubs in the area, but to date nothing has been organised which brings together those of us who enjoy the game, and indeed others who might like to give the sport a try.
